





Analysis

Based on the data recorded and shown, there has been a general increase in occupied storefronts over the years.


Some of these increases in occupied storefronts can be attributed to the following:


- increase in opening businesses in 125th Street,
- · the subdividing of properties, and
- an increase in development within 125th Street.

Another factor to mention is the progression of storefront occupancies between the Northside of 125th street and the Southside of 125th street differs, because of the occupancy of certain streets that may contain city or state owned such as the following:


- Adam Clayton Powell State Office Building,
- General Grant Houses,
- New York Fire Department,
- George Bruce Branch of the New York Public Library, and
- the Manhattan Borough President's Office.

Those properties, while taken up by the public sector, can take up from a quarter of a block to a block and a half.
